
Village Hope Goals:

- Nurture youth through various sports programs (track& field), basketball, soccer) with the assistance of former athletes who will prepare them for competitions.







HISTORY OF FOND JACQUES DEVELOPMENT (JACQUES MIRINGUOIN) LEOGANE, HAITI

In 2010 the nation of Haiti was rocked by a catastrophic earthquake of 7.0 magnitude, with the hardest hit area or epicenter near the town of Léogâne, approximately 16 miles west of Port-au-Prince the capital. It all happened around 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, 12 January 2010, and up until twelve days later, a whopping 52 aftershocks measuring 4.5 or greater had been recorded. The quake devastated the western hemisphere's poorest nation, affecting an estimated three million people with a reported 316,000 people dead, 300,000 injured and over 1,000,000 homeless. The damage caused by the earthquake was so extensive that notable landmark buildings like the Presidential Palace,

the National Assembly building, the Port-au-Prince Cathedral, and the main jail were all reduced to rubble.

In the aftermath of this untimely disaster, the international community displayed much kindness for Haiti providing humanitarian aid, pledging funds and dispatching rescue and medical teams, engineers and support personnel. But confusion ran rampant because of the damaged nature of all communication systems, electrical networks, and hospitals. There was a lack of coordination and cooperation that led to delays in aid distribution, causing looting and sporadic violence amongst angry and frustrated survivors.

Like many other concerned non-profit organization, Heirs of Salvation, Inc. (HOS) came on the scene to pitch into the recovering efforts. We provided temporary shelter to the homeless by building tents in Source-Corossol, Leogane epicenter of quake. But, the challenges continued to amount, as rising temperatures during the day and torrential rain during the night threatened to thwart our efforts. Our humanitarian aid was clearly insufficient, as more and more Haitians were victimized by floods, mudslides, and mosquito bites.

Mrs. Esperance, founder of HOS, got together with concerned friends and families, to try to raise sufficient funds for the construction of permanent, anti-seismic homes for the aforementioned victims. Despite being financially challenged, HOS managed to build several home, the first of which went to a family of eight. They were so happy and thankful to HOS that they asked to be joined in holy matrimony. It had been a dream of theirs; and they did not want to tarnish their newly built home by co-habiting in it. They suddenly had burning desire to be sanctified and holy before the God who had just performed

a great miracle in their lives. HOS proceeded to grant their wish, and now feels burdened with the need to make a difference in the area.

Fresh off the momentum of this great story, Mrs. Esperance went back to huddle with her supporters, hoping to figure out ways to raise funds to sponsor others in the area. On July 16th 2011, Heirs of Salvation sponsored its first official wedding at the Bon Berger Church in Leogane. Both the bride and groom showed their gratitude by selecting HOS founder, Mrs. Esperance as their Maid of Honor. This story however led to yet another inspiration because the couple could neither read nor write. When asked to sign their Marriage Certificate, they could only place an "x" to represent themselves on an official document. As a result, Mrs. Esperance felt compelled to implement an adult alphabetization class charged with educating adults in the region.

Last year in December, Heirs of Salvation bought a parcel of land in Leogane, Haiti to build a development center in an effort to provide the necessary education to both youth & adults. On January 9th, 2012, HOS held the inauguration of the center while promoting education in the community, as well as its impact on every-day life. The meeting was a great success; and HOS took to heart every one of their concerns, including: the lack of transportation for school children, access roads, drainage for heavy rain water, portable water, Electricity, the need for jobs, recreational centers, along with health, social & educational institutions.

Mrs. Esperance has been and remains totally committed to the restoration of Haiti. Through her organization, HOS, she's had a tremendous impact on Haiti, particularly the people of Leogane. He's devoted to the task, and has spared nothing in delivering humanitarian

aid to the region. She's got friends and family fully engaged in the vision, all seeking to rebuild and improve the quality of life in Leogane. In fact, she's enlisted her son Mr. Joed Esperance to actively pursue resources and opportunities that can help achieve and advance the vision of Heritiers du Salut, HOS. Mr. Joed Esperance reached out to several U.S. organizations for assistance, including Mount Saint Mary College which has already donated 25 computers this year. These computers will help HOS educate and prepare young men and women for brighter future in Haiti. HOS has also undertaken a new initiative to build a community center to promote sports like basketball, soccer, track and field within the community. HOS currently has a comprehensive plan to rebuild, re-establish and develop in the area to create jobs and other benefits to those living in the region. You can read all about the details below.
